The scheme was developed to assist in Preston City Council's aims and objectives of physically and economically regenerating the city centre. The scheme lies at the forefront of the city's 'Flare' project, a lighting strategy for the city to assist in its quest to become the 3rd City of the North West through a number of city centre enhancements to make Preston a more attractive place to be after dark.

The scheme is designed to highlight individual aspects of the facades and to draw attention to key details through a combination of colour temperatures of white light and the use of shadow to add perspective and depth to the visual scene.

Key facts and information

Fittings have been chosen that are small, discrete and can be easily matched in colour to the stone of the facade.

The equipment uses LED's as the principle light source. These are extremely efficient and consume very little energy compared to traditional lighting sources. In addition, little maintenance is required due to their very long life. Using LED's reduces the risk of accidental damage during maintenance.
